






Why Research Methods Matter

• Data → Evidence → Better programmes & advocacy









Why Research Methods Matter

Methods shape what we can conclude

• Right method = relevant, actionable, ethical evidence

Desk Research

- **Definition:** Using existing documents, reports, and data sources.

Desk Research

Activity:

Interviews

- Semi-structured conversations to explore perspectives in depth.

- Observer notes good probing questions and listening skills.












Observations

- Watching behaviours, processes, or environments systematically.
- Activity: Observe your partner doing a short task.
- What details did you capture that others might miss?












Document Analysis

- Systematic review of existing documents (reports, case files, policies).
- Activity: Review a short excerpt (provided).
- What insights can we gain? What are the limitations?











Case Study: Sophia

- Sophia noticed women clients were less likely than men to fill prescriptions.
- Group task: Design a mini research plan for Sophia:
- Main research question
- Method(s) to use, and why
- • Challenges to consider (ethics, culture, logistics)




