Now in its sixth year, the FEF-OSC stands as a cornerstone of France's partnership with Nigerian civil society. Through targeted financial and technical support, the Fund empowers locally led organisations to tackle some of the country's most pressing challenges—**gender inequality, economic vulnerability, and community resilience**.

This year's edition marks a significant scale-up, with **19 civil society organisations** (CSOs) selected through a competitive process to implement high-impact projects across diverse Nigerian communities. The selected initiatives will receive a **one-year grant**, focused not only on immediate results but also on **long-term institutional strengthening**.

Key Programme Priorities:

- Combat gender-based violence and promote women's socio-economic integration;
- Foster sustainable livelihoods for youth and vulnerable groups;
- Strengthen community resilience through advocacy and partnerships.

In collaboration with the **Cognito Project–POD Consulting Consortium**, the programme embeds a robust capacity-building component. Through tailored workshops, coaching, and peer exchange platforms, CSOs will gain essential tools for strategic planning, monitoring and evaluation, financial accountability, and impact storytelling.

At its core, this initiative is about people—the women, men, and youth whose lives are being transformed by the bold and compassionate projects led by local CSOs. Their lived experiences, and the tangible impact of these initiatives in each community, are the true measures of success. They reflect real progress and sustainable change across Nigeria's diverse regions.

Whether supporting survivors of gender-based violence, advancing health equity, mentoring youth, or creating economic opportunities for vulnerable groups, these organisations represent the power of collaborative, inclusive, and innovative local leadership.

Since its inception in 2019, the FEF-OSC has supported Nigerian civil society initiatives in areas ranging from **health equity and disability rights to conflict mediation and social cohesion**. The 2025 cohort builds on this legacy, advancing key global goals including:

- **SDG 3** – Good Health and Well-being
- **SDG 5** – Gender Equality
- **SDG 16** – Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions
- **SDG 17** – Partnerships for the Goals
